Jeremy began his policing career in 1996 with North Wales Police, rising to Chief Superintendent and leading Local Policing Services. In 2016, he joined South Wales Police as Assistant Chief Constable with responsibility for Specialist Operations, including Professional Standards, Criminal Justice, Operational Planning and the Public Service Centre. In 2017 he took responsibility for the Territorial Policing portfolio including leading on Neighbourhood and Response Policing and was promoted to Deputy Chief Constable in 2019.

Jeremy is the Vice Chair of the National Police Chiefs' Council which brings together UK police leaders to set direction in policing and drive progress for the public. He is also the Chair of the NPCC Science and Innovation Coordination Committee (SICC), which aims to provide strategic guidance and direction for the delivery and implementation of the National Policing Science and Technology (S&T) Strategy. Jeremy is the UK Policing Lead for HeForShe, UN Women's global movement for gender equality. A fluent Welsh speaker, Jeremy was appointed to the Gorsedd Cymru in 2019 for services to the Welsh language in policing. In December 2024 he received a King's Police Medal (KPM) for services to policing.
